In early May, I reached out to several Chicago legislators with the following message, asking for their support in helping pass Progressive Revenue Measures to improve funding for public schools. I received several positive replies back, all in support of such measures and vowing their support even for re-introducing the Progressive Tax Measure that unfortunately failed in 2020.

Hello, I'm reaching out to urge you to pass progressive revenue options like closing corporate tax loopholes and decoupling from unwise federal tax provisions.
