E. President's Report - J. Braglia

- 1. Update Legislative Director Position
- 2. Political Action:
 - a. 2015 Timeline: J. Braglia presented an updated Political Action Plan for the rest of the year. We need to be vigilant and united.
 - b. Areas of Concern for Public Education Union Members: J. Braglia presented a one-page summary of proposed legislation that could impact education and collective bargaining rights.
 - c. SB 1 (2015): J. Braglia provided summary of SB 1 (2015) that would change the funding formula for schools.
 - d. Lobby Days: The date is set for April 15-16. We will be inviting legislators to a discussion where we can directly ask them their positions on key proposed legislation that could directly impact our ability to provide an education to our kids.
 - e. Pensions: We are awaiting a decision by the Illinois Supreme Court on SB 1 (2014).
 - f. School Board Elections: We need people to vote in the upcoming elections. Historically, voter turnout is low for these elections.
 - g. Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA): This is 8 years overdue to reauthorize. This is the legislation that created RttT that allows student growth to impact the evaluation document. Revamp or Reauthorization could come up in the Senate or House this year.
- 3. SLO Training at Local 571- February 26, 2015: Dave Moravek attended a training session on SLOs in Westmont. He provided a summary.
- 4. March 2nd: J. Braglia attended a fundraiser at the Sheet Metal Hall, Local 73 (Ron Izzo's former hall). We are trying to increase our presence within the AFL.
- 5. IFT Vice-President's meeting: J. Braglia attended the IFT Vice-Presidents' meeting in Springfield last weekend. The IFT is hard at work anticipating a coordinated attack on those in education. The IFT provided a lot of training regarding issues that are impacting our Local.
- 6. Dues collection: The Local will be developing a program to collect dues from members in the event that payroll deductions are suspended by Executive Order.
- 7. Legislative Breakfast: It will be this Saturday. IFT President Dan Montgomery will be the keynote speaker. Toby Trimmer, Political Director of the IFT, will be moderating a panel of state legislators.
